Greeves St. Voices is a program designed for your school, workplace or organisation. It offers the opportunity to learn about St Kilda Gatehouse, an organisation supporting marginalised women involved in street sex work as a result of abuse, addiction, poverty and other hardships.

GREEVES ST. PROJECT WORKSHOP

Learn how the Greeves St. social enterprise bridges the gap between marginalised women and the community. Produce beautiful gifts to sell to help raise funds to support women involved in street based sex work. Sessions are run by an experienced arts and crafts trained teacher, who will share poignant stories of the women, bringing them to life and illustrating their warmth and resilience – even through extreme adversity.

The Greeves St. Project workshop costs \$225 (+GST) for up to 15 participants.

This workshop runs for 1.5 hours.



Gatehouse welcomes organisations to experience an interactive urban walk around St Kilda. The walk speaks to the lives of women involved in street based sex work and looks at issues common to many, including homelessness, addiction, mental health, abuse and social isolation. As we follow the set route we will share stories that illuminate the women's experiences. Our educational walk helps break down stereotypes and will introduce groups to wider cultural issues and promote consideration of the risks associated with alcohol and drug abuse.

Hear about the history of the streets and the characters who lived in St Kilda, from the 1850's to present day, and learn how those currently experiencing homelessness and marginalisation find help and support in the 2000's.

Visit the St Kilda Gatehouse drop in center and learn about the work of this grassroots organisation, which has supported marginalised and stigmatised women in Melbourne's inner south for twenty-five years.

The Urban Walk costs \$350 (+GST) for up to 15 participants.

The Urban Walk runs for around 2.5 hours (depending on how fast participants walk).

URBAN WALK



This is a very popular session, where participants learn about the Young Women's Project based in Dandenong, which works with young women aged from 12 to 25 who are at risk of or affected by commercial sexual exploitation.

Engage in activities, which highlight respect for women, how women and girls might find themselves on the margins of society and how we can respond by working to create a fairer and more just society.

The Young Women's Project workshop costs \$225 (+GST) for up to 15 participants.
